Shelf/Wall Clock. by Jerome, Bransea Castle, Dorset Glass Tablet.c1880</p> <p data-bbox="188 315 1062 945">A very attractive O.G. shelf/wall clock manufactured around 1880 by Chauncey Jerome- New Haven Clock Company, USA. The OG is by far and away the most important clock that America has produced. The name was derived for ogive, which is the shape of the moulding that forms the front of the case surrounding the door that gives access to the dial and movement. The grain of the veneer on the front of the clock is applied across instead of parallel to the length. The veneer on this clock is rosewood and it has a very pleasant patina. The sides and back of the clock are made of pine with a stained finish. The case is in good condition, there is a repair to some veneer loss at the bottom left hand corner. It is approx. 39 x 65 x 11cm.The interesting part of this clock is the original glass tablet, this is the reverse painted/transfer printed glass plate below the clocks face. The tablet depicts Bransea Castle, Dorset, England. The original paper advert is still in place inside the clock, although a little worn around the edges. The clock has a weight driven two train 30 hour movement, recently overhauled, new weight lines and suspension fitted and is in working order supplied with a key and instructions to hang the clock. <p data-bbox="296 958 962 992">Seth Thomas 8 day drop dial with calendar c1920.</p> <p data-bbox="188 999 1062 1344">This is quite a rare drop dial wall clock. The quality 8 day two train movement was manufactured in USA around 1920 by Seth Thomas. The clock strikes a gong on the hour. There is an additional movement to run the calendar pointer with moon shaped end that indicates the date via the numbers around the outer edge of the dial. The painted metal dial is approx. 29cm and enclosed by a glazed brass bezel. Below the dial is another glazed brass bezel to view and give access to the pendulum bob. The wooden case has a stained finish with some brass decoration around the lower bezel. It is approx. 65 x 39 x 11cm. The case is made of veneered rosewood and stained pine. There is a mirror fitted to the backboard to reflex the large brass pendulum.</p> <p data-bbox="188 1615 1062 1742">The case has turned pillared side, detailed fretwork and boxwood designed inlay to the front below the door. A 30cm painted metal dial with roman numerals. There is some paint loss around the key winding hole.
